How it all began

The first "official" meeting of the Moto Guzzi Owners Association was held at a waterhole on a small property at Buckety, in the hills at the back of Gosford, on a particularly hot day in February 1980, following the inaugural run by the fledgling club.

A working committee was duly elected at the waterhole and was subsequently ratified at the Association's first Annual General Meeting, which took place a few months later on May 20th at the Ashfield RSL Youth Club Hall. At that meeting a formal constitution was adopted by the 29 founding members, many of whom are still in the club today.

With the average membership of about 100 people, the Moto Guzzi Owners Association has never been large but it more than makes up for this in enthusiasm and friendliness. As followers of an exotic and noble marque of Italian motorcycle, members show a great deal of mutual support when it comes to technical or other problems associated with the breed.

What the Club does

Members meet regularly on the second Tuesday of each month at 8pm at the Friend in Hand Hotel, 58 Cowper Street, Glebe. For those that come earlier a meal is available from 7pm.

The club also has a social sip, at various locations, the last Friday of every second month to enable members who can't get to meetings to get involved. Venues for these are advertised in the club newsletter, "Falcone".

There is a club run practically every month. In addition there are certain feature events such as the Ruptured Budgie Rally (Qld. Guzzi Club), Spaghetti Rally (Vic. Guzzi Club) and other selected rallies that are attended by the club as a group.

The most important event of all is the MGOA's own Ragged Fringe¹ Rally, which the club puts on every September.

Other events appearing in the club calendar include Auction Days, Pub runs and a very special Christmas weekend party.

There is a newsletter "Falcone", and a website www.mgoa.org, which keeps everyone informed of what's on and also contains technical information and other articles.

As it says in the constitution - "All persons of good character who are interested in Moto Guzzis and in fostering and maintaining Moto Guzzi ownership and in motorcycling, are... eligible for election to membership."
